Fort Lauderdale Aquatic Center Renovation Project



Construction Start Opening April 2019 October 2020

On July 10, 2018 the Fort Lauderdale City Commission authorized staff to negotiate a design-build contract for the renovation of the Fort Lauderdale Aquatic Center with Hensel Phelps Construction Company in the not-to-exceed amount of \$27,000,000.

Hensel Phelps was awarded a design-build contract on August 21, 2018 with a guaranteed maximum price of \$26,995,368 based upon their own due diligence and the design criteria package in City's Request for Proposals (RFP) No. 12072-483 which provides specifications, requirements and 30% schematic designs.

#### Major elements of the design include:

- Remove existing 50M main competition pool and provide a new expanded fully FINA compliant standard pool with two stainless bulkheads. Size: 53M x 25M, 10 lanes; Depth: 2M – 3M – 2M
- Remove existing diving pool and provide new fully FINA compliant diving pool and tower including five platform levels (1M, 3M, 5M, 7.5M, 10M), and 1M and 3M springboards; Size: 25M x 25M; Depth: 6M
- Remove existing spa for divers and provide new spa. Size: 14FT x 10FT
- Repair existing 50M Training Pool with new surfacing and gutters. Size: 50M x 25Y; Depth 4FT 12.6FT

# Paris captures three gold medals at Ohio senior Olympics

South Euclid resident Susan Paris won three gold medals at the Ohio Senior Olympic State Games on May 5 at Westerville Community Center in Westerville, a suburb of Columbus. She finished first in three swimming events and second in two other events. Paris, 73, finished first in the 70 to

Paris, 73, mission first in the 100 yard freestyle, 74 age group in the 100-yard freestyle, 200-yard freestyle and 500-yard freestyle events. She earned silver in the 50yard freestyle and 50-yard backstroke events.

Paris said she started her athletic career as a marathon runner, but gave up running in the 1990s and switched to swimming. She trains at the Mandel Jewish Community Center in Beachwood, where she swims about 5 miles a week and 20 miles a month. She said she wasn't expecting to win gold at the event and attended the competition with some friends.

"I had heard about (the competition) for a couple years and just decided I was going to do it this year," Paris said. "I was very surprised and happy (to win). It was just something exciting, what can I say?"

Paris, who is retired, said she plans one more competitive race this summer, the 2019 Brogan Open Water Classic July 13 at Edgewater Park in Cleveland. She will compete in the half-mile swim.
